
Fellowship, Goodwill, and Community Service

Each Ruritan club surveys the needs of its community and then works to meet those needs.

Ruritan began in Holland, Virginia, in 1928. Since then, the Ruritan tradition of local community service has expanded to include more than 25,000 Ruritan volunteers. This continued tradition has earned Ruritan the reputation as "America's Leading Community Service Organization" in more than 1,000 communities across the nation.


Ruritan clubs provide and coordinate a wide range of community improvement projects and activities, including community fundraisers, food drives, and scholarships to qualified students. Many Ruritan clubs also support local youth organizations such as 4-H, FFA, Youth Athletic Leagues, scouts, and others. Many Ruritan clubs donate plush **Rudy Bears** to hospitals, school counselors, and emergency and law enforcement agencies to provide cheer and comfort for children in times of crisis.



Ruritan clubs hold informative and educational monthly meetings that give Ruritan members an opportunity to share ideas about community improvements and service projects. Club meetings feature a fellowship meal, a club business session, and an educational or entertaining program for club



members. Most Ruritan club meetings usually last an hour and a half or less. Ruritan clubs are composed of concerned citizens who represent a cross section of the community that the club serves. Men and women of all professions, ages, and ethnic backgrounds enjoy Ruritan membership.



Basic Benefits of Membership

Ruritans believe the most important benefit of membership is the opportunity to work in fellowship with people who have a desire to make their communities better places in which to live.

In addition to that very important benefit, Ruritan members also receive a membership card and a quarterly magazine of Ruritan news and community service tips. Free leadership training and other programs help Ruritan members get the most out of their community service efforts.
